- 1. The Government of the Republic of Kenya (GoK) has received financing in the amount equivalent to US\$215 Million from the World Bank towards the cost of the Building Resilient and Responsive Health Systems (BREHS) project and it intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments for goods, works, non-consulting services and consulting services to be procured under this project. This project will be jointly financed by the Government of the Republic of Kenya (GoK).
- 2. The project will include the following components
 - 2.1.Component 1 Strengthening Institutional Capacity for Health Service Delivery Towards Achieving Universal Health Care The aim of this component is to ensure timely availability of Health Products and Technologies to primary health care facilities, support the recently introduced Government Universal Health Care reforms, and improve availability and use of quality data for decision making.
 - 2.2.Component 2. Improving utilization of quality health services at the primary care level This component will support Procurement and distribution of Health Products and Technologies to primary care facilities, support implementation of key quality of care-related interventions delivered at the primary care level, provide additional targeted support to 10 under-performing counties lagging on key Reproductive, Maternal, Neonatal, Child, Adolescent Health (RMNCAH), and Improve access to and utilization of quality health services in refugee camps and host communities in Garissa and Turkana Counties.

- 2.3. Component 3. Project Management- This component will support project implementation, coordination, and the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) capacity building.
- 3. The goods and consulting services that will be procured through Open International Competitive Procurement include:
 - 3.1. Supply and Delivery of Pharmaceutical Products: Amlodipine tablets, Ferrous/ Folic Acid Tablets, Losartan tablets, Metformin tablets, Atorvastatin tablets, Carbamazepine tablets, Fluoxetine tablets, Chlorhexidine Gel, Tetracycline Ointment, Salbutamol nebulizing solution, Lignocaine, Oxytocin, Magnesium Sulphate.
 - 3.2. Supply and Delivery of Non-Pharmaceuticals Products: Latex Examination Gloves, sterile gloves.
 - 3.3. Supply and Delivery of Laboratory Commodities: Anti Human Globulin vials, Anti A, Anti B, Anti D (polyclonal), Glucose (blood) strips), urinalysis strips, pregnancy testing strips, syphilis strips, Frosted endglass slides, PSA Rapid Kits, Occult Blood Rapid Test Kits, Human papillomavirus (HPV) self-sample collection kits, Haemoglobin Cuvettes.
 - 3.4. Supply and Delivery of Maternal and Neonatal Equipment: Non-pneumatic anti-shock garment, Uterine Balloon Tamponade (UBT) Kits, Uterine balloon tamponades, Delivery packs, Foetal Doppler, Pulse Oximeters, Manual Vacuum Aspiration (MVA) Kits, AVD Kits, Point of care ultrasound, Modern delivery bed, Baby Weighing Scale, Sterilizers, Mechanical ventilators, Examination lamps, Infusion pumps, Resuscitator for baby, Patient monitor.
 - 3.5. Supply and Delivery of Nutritional Commodities: Multiple Nutritional Products (MNP), Ready to Use Supplementary Food (RUSF), Ready to Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF), Therapeutic Milk, fortified blended flour for pregnant, lactating mothers and children, Enteral Feeds, Parenteral Feeds, Rehydration Solution for Malnutrition (ReSoMal), Fortified blended flour for children.
 - 3.6. Consulting services for Individual consultants (5 No. Assistant Project Coordinators).
- 4. Procurement of contracts financed by the World Bank will be conducted through the procedures as specified in the World Bank's Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers, dated July 2016 and Revised Fifth Edition September 2023, (Procurement Regulations), and is open to all eligible firms and individuals as defined in the Procurement Regulations. After Project negotiations, the World Bank shall arrange the publication on its external website of the agreed initial procurement plan and all subsequent updates once it has provided a no objection.
