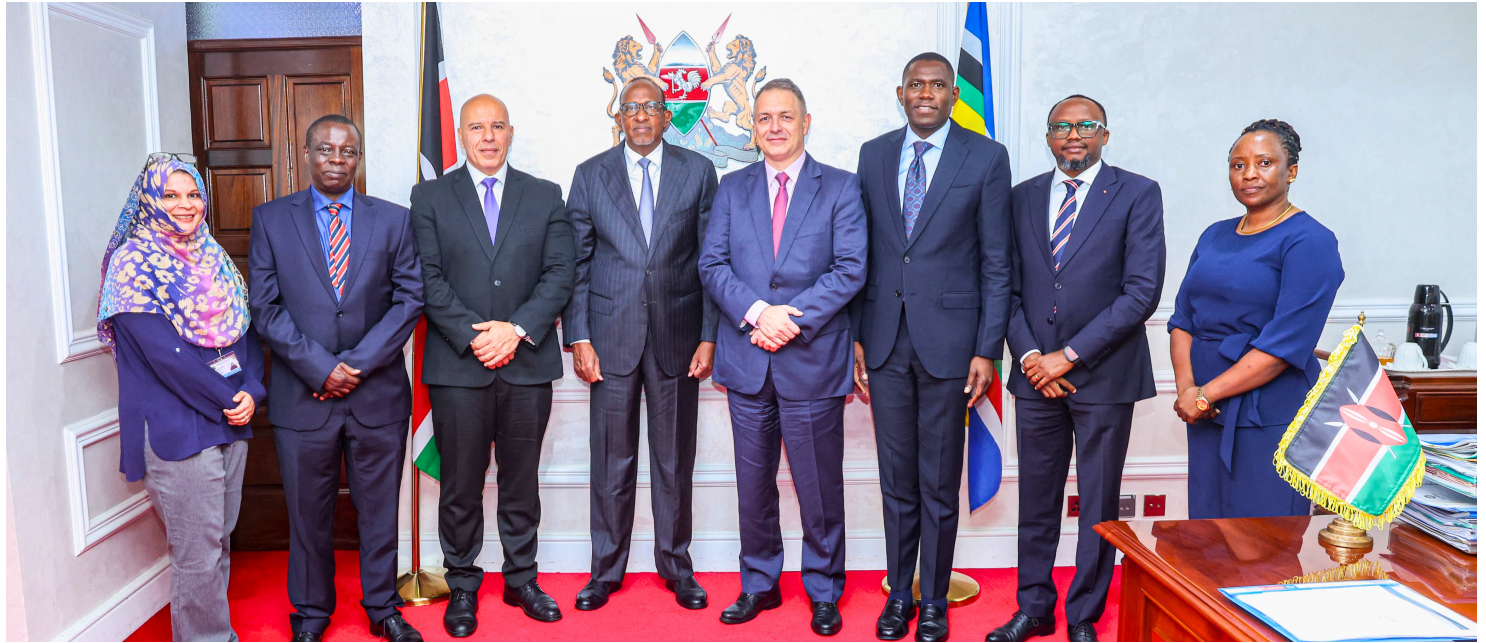




MoH Strengthens Strategic Partnership with GE Healthcare

Cabinet Secretary for Health Hon. Aden Duale held bilateral talks with Dr. Konstantinos Deligiannis of GE Healthcare to strengthen collaboration in health financing, digital transformation, advanced medical technologies, healthcare infrastructure and health workforce development in support of Universal Health Coverage (UHC).

The meeting reviewed progress under the National Equipment Service Programme (NESP) and explored opportunities to expand access to affordable medical technologies through innovative financing, technology transfer, local assembly, maintenance, biomedical engineering capacity building and integration with Kenya's Digital Health Superhighway.

The Cabinet Secretary reaffirmed the Government's commitment to strategic partnerships that strengthen health systems, expand access to specialised healthcare services and support the implementation of Taifa Care. Principal Secretary for Medical Services, Dr. Ouma Oluga, also attended the meeting.

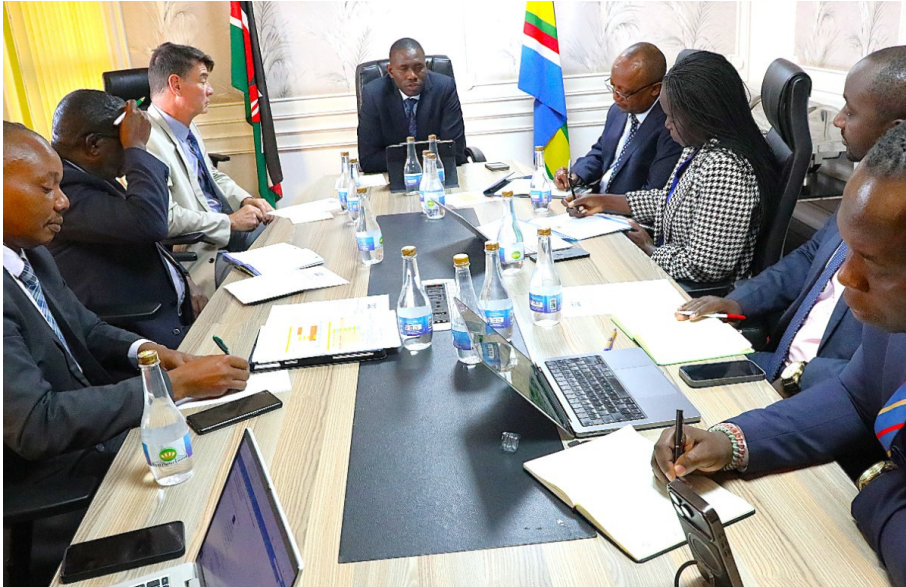
Community Health Data Verification Exercise Continues in Nyandarua

Principal Secretary for Public Health and Professional Standards, Ms. Mary Muthoni, continued the Community Health Assessment Data Verification exercise in Mirangine and Kanjuiri wards, Ol Kalou Sub County, Nyandarua County, where Community Health Promoters validated household health data and reviewed findings from the recent community health assessment.

Preliminary findings indicate improved access to healthcare services and better-equipped public health facility laboratories, while highlighting priority areas requiring further investment to strengthen primary healthcare service delivery.

The Principal Secretary reaffirmed that accurate and reliable community health data is essential for evidence-based planning, equitable resource allocation and the advancement of Universal Health Coverage. The exercise will continue in the remaining wards before being rolled out in other parts of the country.
